



Tree Information Sheet

Below you will find information about the different species offered at the Tree For All event.

Baldcypress

Taxodium distichum

Height and spread: 50 to 70 feet tall by 20 to 45 feet wide

Sun requirements: full sun

Bloom Color and time: non-flowering

Notables: This low maintenance tree is one of only five deciduous conifers in the world. In late fall its leaves turn a beautiful rust-orange before dropping for the winter. It can tolerate dry to wet soils and in wet soils develops "knees" that protrude from the roots above the ground. Prefers moist, acidic, sandy soils.



Sawtooth Oak

Quercus acutissima

Height and spread: 40 to 60 feet by 40 to 60 feet

Sun requirements: full sun

Bloom Color and time: insignificant yellowish-green flowers; March to April

Notables: Medium-sized deciduous tree with golden-brown fall color and abundant acorns that are great for wildlife. Makes a great shade tree. Adjusts to a wide range of soils but performs best in rich, humusy, medium moisture soils.

Autumn Blaze Maple

Acer x freemanii 'Jeffersred' Autumn Blaze

Height and spread: 40 to 55 feet tall by 30 to 40 feet wide

Sun requirements: full sun to part shade

Bloom Color and time: greenish-yellow to red; rarely flowers with insignificant blooms

Notables: This deciduous tree offers beautiful orange-red to scarlet-red fall color, is fast-growing and low maintenance. Prefers well-draining, moist, acidic soils.



October Glory Maple

Acer rubrum 'October Glory'

Height and spread: 40 to 50 feet by 30 to 40 feet

Sun requirements: full sun to part shade

Bloom Color and time: shiny dark green leaves, red flowers

Notables: During the spring and summer, the deciduous tree has shiny dark green leaves. Tiny red flowers also appear in the spring. In the fall, the tree dazzles with gleaming crimson and orange-red leaves. The leaves begin to fall late in the season. The tree tolerates a variety of soil including clay, loam and sand. Ideal conditions include well-drained, slightly acidic soil. Landscapers and gardeners use red maple as shade trees.



Eastern Redbud

Cercis Canadensis

Height and spread: 20 to 30 feet by 25 to 35 feet

Sun requirements: full sun to part shade

Bloom Color and time: pink to purple; April

Notables: Deciduous tree with beautiful spring flowers that makes a great understory tree. Flowers fade to beautiful glossy heart-shaped leaves. Easily grown in moderately fertile soils with medium moisture and good drainage.

Dynamite Crapemyrtle

Lagerstroemia indica 'Whit II' Dynamite

Height and spread: 8 to 20 feet by 8 to 18 feet

Sun requirements: full sun

Bloom Color and time: red; July to September

Notables: Long-blooming deciduous shrub with beautiful flowers, good fall color and peeling bark in winter. Can tolerate drought once established. Performs best in average medium moisture well-draining soils.
